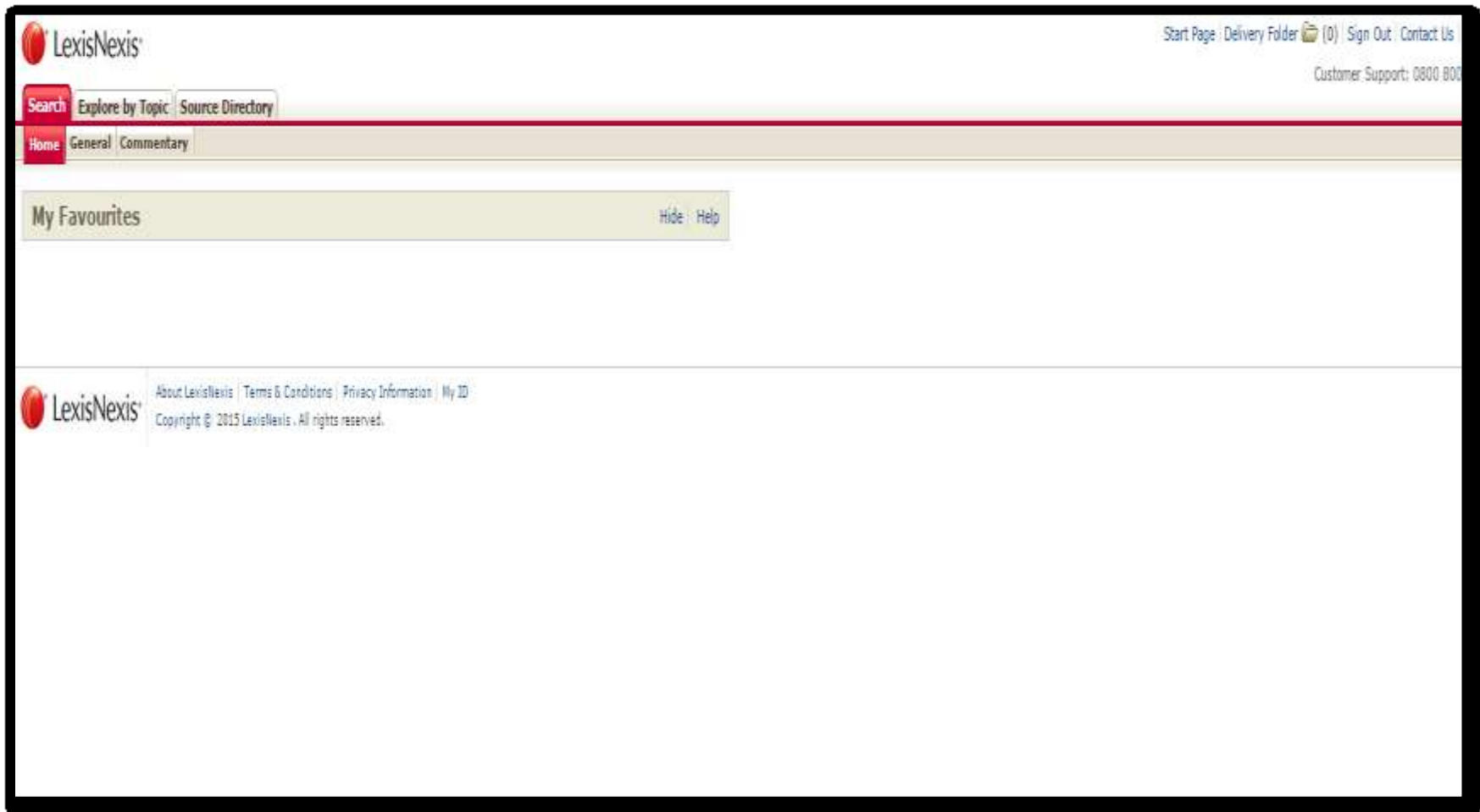

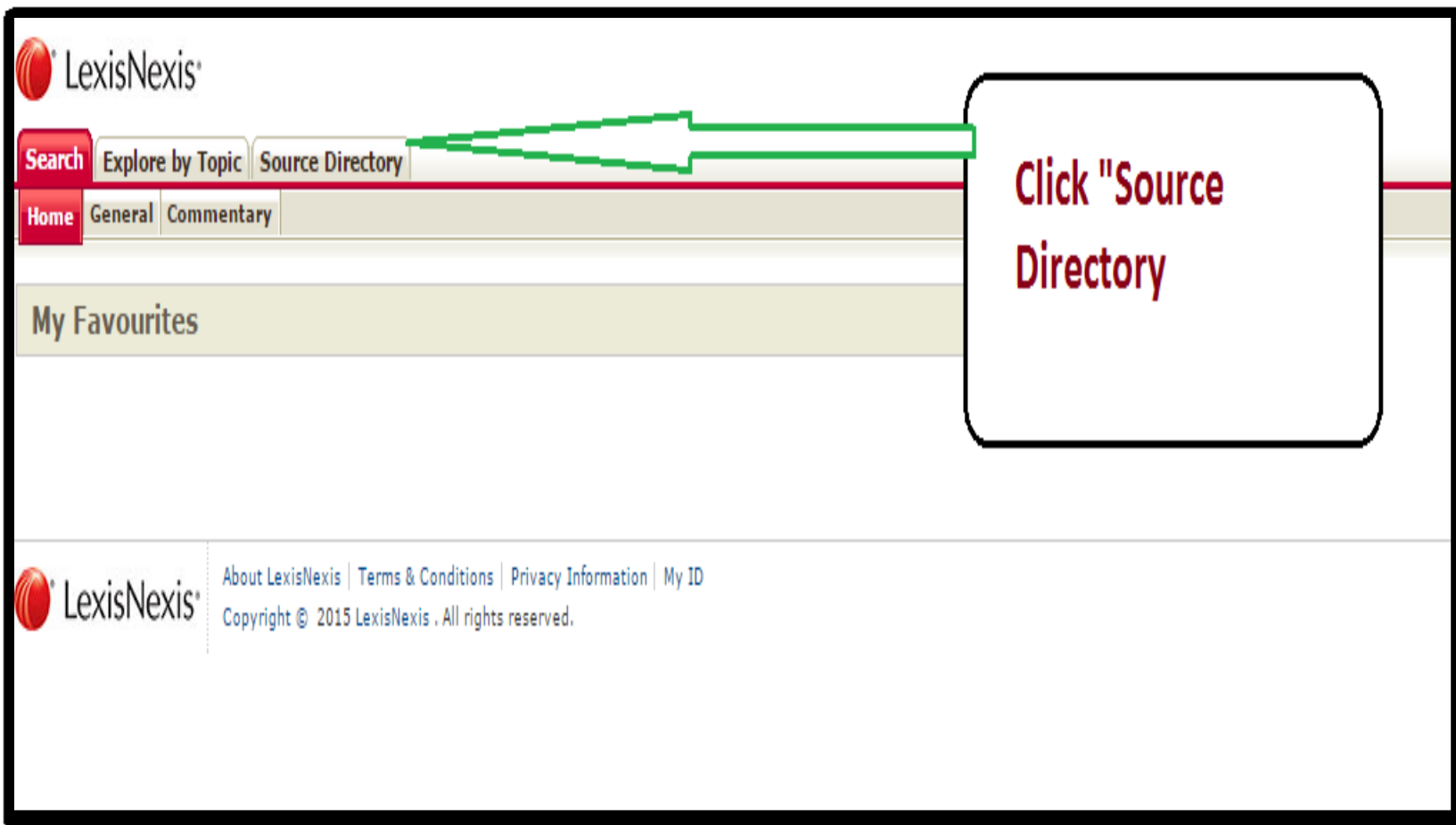

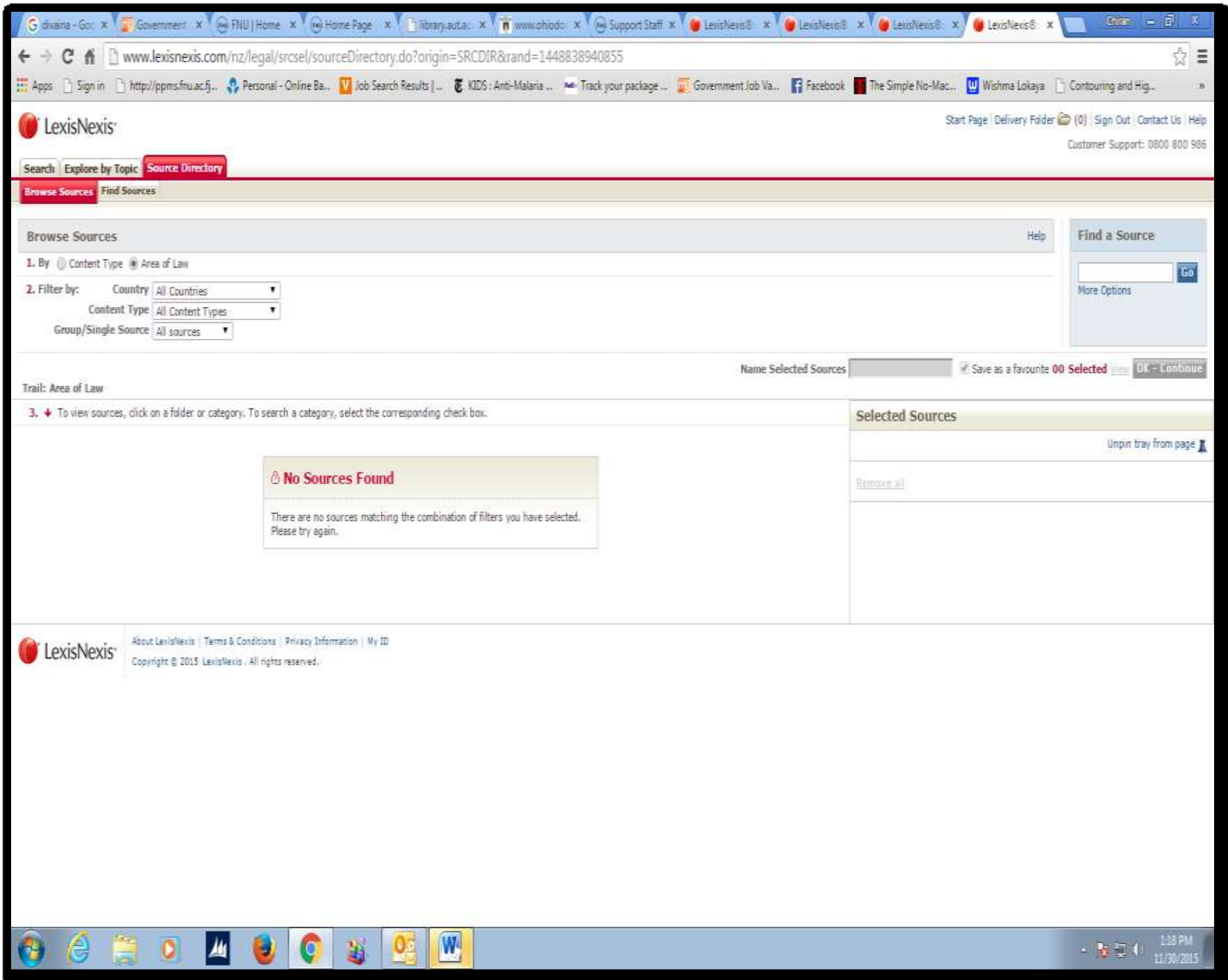
1. When you click “LexisNexis NZ Legal” in FNU library website, you will be directed to the following window.

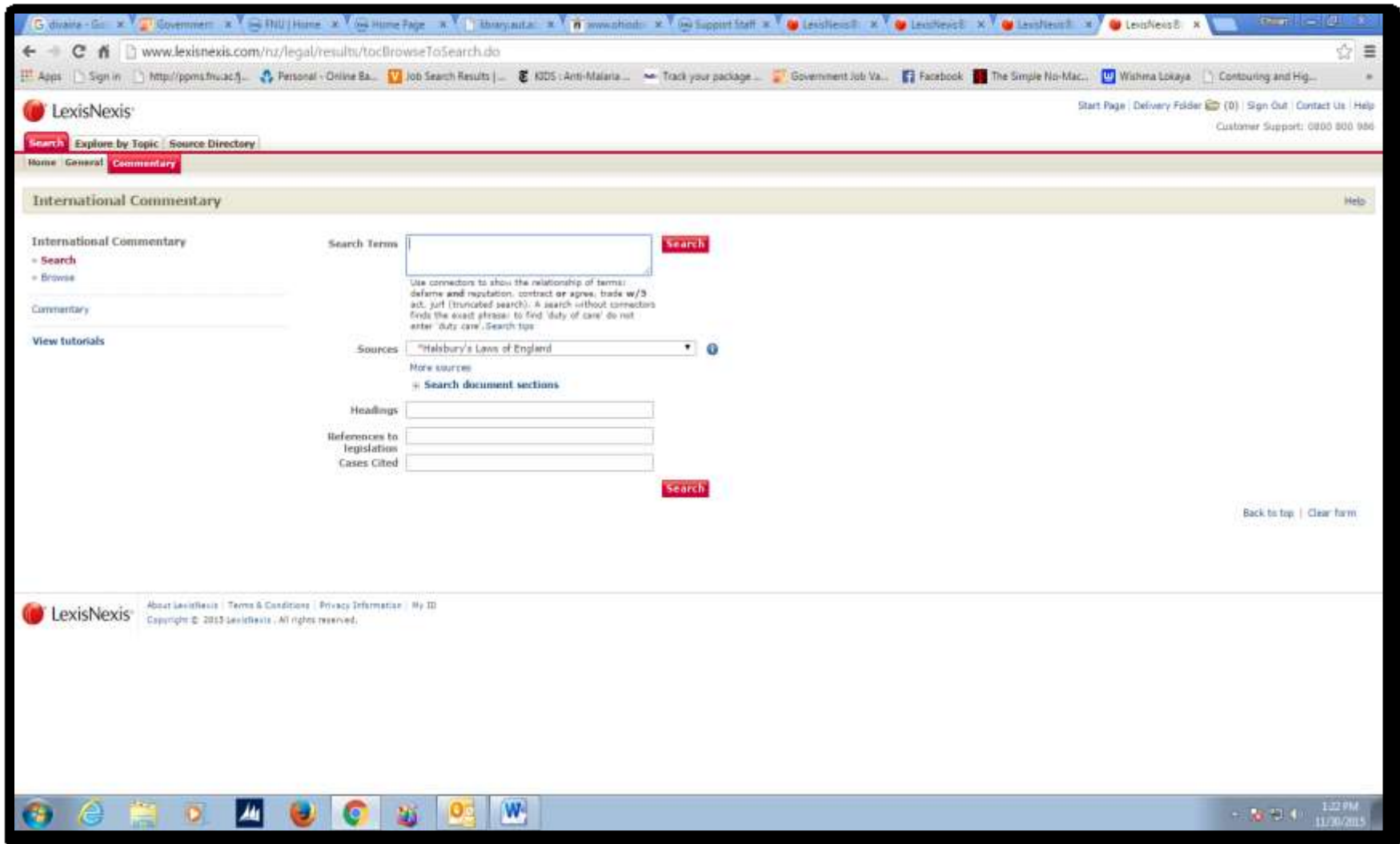
