FNU Library reserves copyright policy, which is available on the FNU Library home page and we have subscribed to 69 electronic resources such as EBSCO HOST, JSTOR, PROQUEST, Science Direct, Emerald, Sage, etc. and all database information is protected by copyright to promote remote learning. These databases contain scholarly and peer-reviewed articles written by credible authors, journalists, researchers and experts in their field.

At a time like this when online mode of learning is being made available, FNU Library has made things easier and better by providing access to information via electronic resources to users from outside the campus. Users just need EZproxy (http://ezproxy.fnu.ac.fj:2048/login) and their Moodle username and password and with a click, the required information is readily available for research and reading, to expand scholarly knowledge.

With this, I urge everyone all to read and never stop as 'Reading eliminates the sense of loneliness' with the mind in a state of creative inventions.
