Description and purpose of the job: International Peer Mentors (IPMs) are an integral part of International Student Support's outreach activities by Centre for Learning & Teaching Enhancement. During Semester

- Be matched with up to 1-4 incoming international students
- Spend an hour with your mentee for each session in the first 3 weeks of the semester
- During the semester, it is as per need basis, whereupon you can liaise with your mentees
- Communicate with your mentees via email or social network on a monthly basis throughout the semester
- Report to the ISMP coordinator, give feedbacks and attend meetings as and when required

- Completed at least 1 semester (applications from students who are currently in their first semester will not be considered)
- Have 1 or more semesters remaining before completing your programme
- Familiar with campus, campus life and student support services
- Good academic standing (3 GPA or higher)
- Dedication to building an inclusive and supportive community
- Strong interest in student and campus engagement
- Respect for all others (values, beliefs, religion, sexual orientation etc.)
- Excellent organisation and communication skills

Personal attributes required:

- Excellent communication skills
- High level of cultural competence and sensitivity
- Ability to work harmoniously within diverse team
