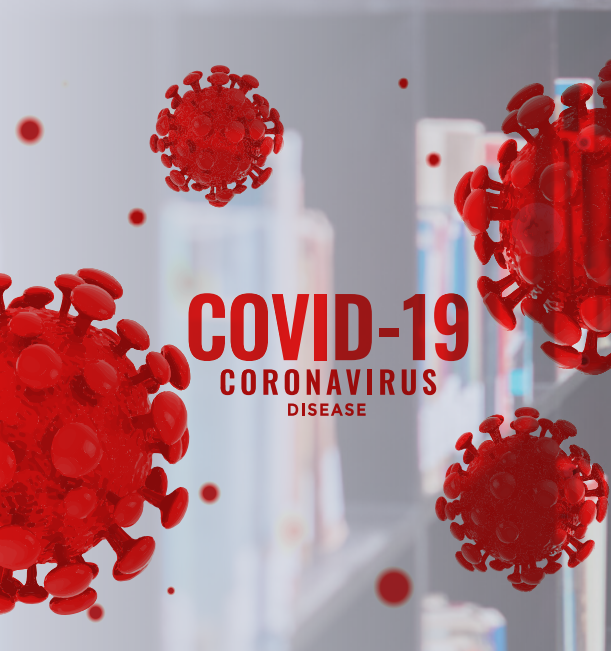
Shelly Shalini
