Recently this

year, additional 500 of EndNote license software has been added which now brings to a total of 1,000 license. Looking For a Journal Article?

There is no need to worry as you can always request journal articles not held by the Library through the Document Delivery Service (DDS) that supports the learning, teaching and research programmes of the University.

All you need to do is just register in the library as a member and send in your request. We are here to find the information for you.

Develop Your Information Literacy Skills

It is very important to know how to search for the right information from the right sources and to also reference the sources to avoid copying and plagiarism. The students need to be information competent to be successful in this world. Library has developed the information literacy session for higher education students and postgraduate students to prepare themselves with the skills and to select and evaluate resources to access the information.

We have professional librarians to train you on how to search information using our library catalogue (OPAC), Resource Discovery Service (EDS), how to use our subscribed databases for information, how to download articles, ways to do referencing using management tools such as ENDNOTE and

RefWorks, how to access e-resources remotely and much more.

The graphs below illustrate the information Literacy training conducted for the CHE Natabua Campus, CBHTS Nadi Campus and CBHTS Ba Campus. The session covers the basic research strategies, search skills, Online OPAC usage internet resources, e-books and e-journals.

In addition, the session introduces the reference management tool for higher degree students, postgraduate students and staffs. Similar trainings are conducted at the rest of FNU campus libraries as well.

The digital library services provided by the university equipped me with resources to undertake necessary research work in my studies. The digital library website facilities resources which enabled me to carry out mandatory literature work. The E-databases particularly IEEE Xplore digital library, Taylor and Francis online, Wiley online, and research4life provided me with relevant research papers and journal articles which helped me to compose my research work's data analysis phase.

The digital library also accommodates reference tools where I specifically used RefWorks. The university's RefWorks access enabled me to easily keep track of the research papers I used in my research, easily generate and add references. With the use of E-databases and RefWorks, I was able to complete my research proposal well in advance and with ease.
