The importance of FNU libraries in supporting and promoting teaching, learning, and research has never been greater. FNU libraries have emphasized the learning environment and students' experiences. The FNU Open Day event took place on October 20th and 21st,2022 at the Nasinu, Natabua, and Naduna campuses. There were a total of 121 secondary schools (on mainland Viti Levu and Vanua Levu), 4 vocational institutes,

3 special schools, 13 professional bodies, 8 village communities, and 4 youth groups (in addition to the public) who attended the two-day event. The library staff presented the library's resources and services during the twoday event through PowerPoint presentations, displays, and a selfie booth, which was the most exciting activity for secondary school students. During the activities, students were asked quiz questions, and giveaways were awarded to the winners. Despite the rainy weather in Central, visitors from schools and the public were upbeat.
