By the time you read this, I would be at the 5th Pacific Islands Universities Research Network (PIURN) Conference happening this week in Rarotonga.

The Network was established in 2012 and is made up of 14 universities, including FNU, across the Pacific Island Countries and Territories to promote meaningful collaboration amongst researchers to identify and address issues affecting our region.

With over 200 delegates participating, the Conference is centred around the theme Exploring this Sea of Islands and covers various fields; from arts to architecture, education to politics, climate science to history, Pacific studies to health, language revitalisation and oceanography.

I look forward to contributing to these discussions and shaping research, training, and future outlooks in the region.

Events as such will only enhance our capabilities, knowledge, and delivery in the fields of learning, teaching and research. Hence, it is crucial that we continue to evaluate and discuss new opportunities and approaches that can strengthen our work.
