USER ENGAGEMENT SERVICES

The Fiji National University (FNU) is dedicated to supporting students and staff in their academic pursuits through various means, including information literacy sessions.

The User Engagement Librarian conducts these sessions to enhance students' learning, teaching, and research abilities. Information literacy sessions at FNU are designed to equip students and staff with the skills to locate, evaluate, and effectively use information from various sources. The User Engagement Librarian conducts these sessions at each campus and is responsible for promoting information literacy among the FNU community.

The sessions are usually held in the library and at ICT labs, and they cover topics such as database searching, citation styles, plagiarism, and academic integrity. One of the ways the User Engagement Librarian supports learning is by offering tailored sessions for individual courses. The librarian works with course coordinators



to identify their courses' specific information literacy needs and develops sessions to address them.

The User Engagement Librarian also supports teaching by conducting sessions for lecturers on incorporating information literacy into their teaching. These sessions help lecturers design assignments requiring students to use information literacy skills, such as locating and evaluating sources. These sessions are aimed at both students and staff and are designed to enhance their research abilities.

CMNHS Onsite Training: Clinical Key Student



The visit of Ms Heather Anderson, a Clinical Key trainer, to the CMNHS (College of Medicine, Nursing, and Health Sciences) campus library in early May 2023 had several positive impacts on the students and staff.

Heather Anderson's visit provided students and staff with specialised knowledge of the Clinical Key database. Onsite training by Heather Anderson at the CMNHS campus library provided hands-on guidance, enhancing trainees' understanding and utilisation of the Clinical Key database. The option for individuals who couldn't attend the onsite training to join

remotely via Zoom allowed for greater accessibility and inclusivity.

This ensured that a larger number of students and staff could benefit from the training, regardless of their physical presence at the library. Not only did she conduct training, but Heather Anderson delivered donated books to the University Librarian, demonstrating a commitment to supporting library resources and enriching collection. She later visited the Nursing School Library to conduct training for nursing students. Heather Anderson tailored nursing training for students, ensuring relevance to their field and enhancing effectiveness and value.

Heather Anderson's visit and campus activities improved CMNHS community knowledge and skills in the Clinical Key database through onsite training, remote participation, and targeted sessions.

Eid Celebration

Eid al-Fitr is an Islamic festival that marks the end of Ramadan, the holy month of fasting when Muslims fast from dawn to dusk each day.

Eid al-Fitr was celebrated on 2/04/2023 during the first three days of Shawwal, which is the tenth month in the Muslim (lunar) calendar. This means that the timing of Eid al-Fitr (and Ramadan) is different every year as it is based on the lunar cycle. It does not begin until the new moon is seen, which means it starts at different times for Muslims worldwide. However, some Muslims choose to celebrate Eid al-Fitr when the new moon first appears over Mecca instead of their own locations. Muslims around the world perform communal prayer at daybreak on the first day of Eid al-Fitr, after cleansing themselves and donning new clothes. They then continue to celebrate for three days. A common greeting during Eid al-Fitr is “Eid Mubarak,” which means “Blessed Eid.” This greeting is used to wish other Muslims well during Eid.



National Library Week

National Library Week is an annual celebration observed from 23 April – 29 April to promote the importance of libraries and library services in communities. It typically takes place during the second week of April and serves as an opportunity to recognise the contributions of libraries, librarians, and library workers.

National Library Week serves as a reminder of libraries’ vital role in society. It encourages people to utilise library resources, attend library programs, and support their local libraries. The week’s activities aim to promote literacy, education, and community involvement, fostering a love for reading and lifelong learning.
