Succeed@FNU is a free online course accessible on Moodle, designed to get students ready for their studies at FNU. The course is designed to help you discover your potential, understand FNU's expectations and rules, explore support systems, and recognise the importance of self-care. By finishing this course, you can be confident that you're an informed student who knows where to find the necessary support services.

First Year Fridays

Engage with our Student Success Specialists in virtual sessions on Fridays from Weeks 2 to 5, where you can learn about university life, share experiences, and clarify doubts.

"My labour as a market vendor is even more meaningful seeing it benefit my children. I am optimistic that three years from now, we will commemorate another milestone when Katalaini completes her programme."

The former Xavier College student received her offer letter instantly at FNU's Roadshow venue in Ba earlier this month.

"I wanted to study Bachelor of Science in Agriculture programme, and it was my dream to be in the agriculture sector- since I come from a farming background, it will be good for me to continue my family legacy in the same field," Anshita said.

"My father speacialises in sugarcane, and vegetable farming so I found the inspiration from him to enrol into this programme. They say that agriculture is a field

that is not in demand in Fiji but I believe there is a huge demand in agriculture field itself as long as you have the will, you can grow in the agricultural sector.

Motivation for Anshita, stems from the shadows of her three older brothers, each carving their unique paths. With one donning a nurse's uniform, another venturing into technical expertise, and the third seeking horizons in Australia, Anshita emerges as the beacon of differentiation, seeking a field where she can truly be herself.

"My brothers have motivated me for the majority of my life, I have three brothers, and they have all studied at FNU. Having brother who are older than me, there has always been a lot of competition between us, and I wanted to pursue a field that is different from theirs."

Aisea (pictured right) who is a Fleet Officer at the National Fire Authority (NFA), shared he initially faced challenges returning to university after taking a hiatus in 2006.

"Over time, I was able to cope, having managed my time wisely and making use of the resources and support services FNU offers."

His determination and perseverance rned him the CEST Student Award for one of the best-performing students in the college in 2023.

"I am really happy to be recognised for my efforts by the college and to be awarded this after an academic gap of 18 years, makes this a proud moment for

Aisea now aims for the gold medal award for the programme as he approaches the final year of his studies.

Undeterred by age, he encourages others to view education as an essential component of success.

"Education is important for personal

growth and professional success. Age should never be a hindrance. I am past 40 years of age, and it has been 18 years since I last studied at the tertiary level with TPAF (now the National Training & Productivity Centre)."

Aisea's story also sheds light on the lesser-explored field of transport technology and management.

"Many students settle for more common technological and engineering fields. The interesting bit about this course is that it comes with a promise of automatic job placement with the Land Transport Authority of Fiji (LTA). So, for aspiring LTA officers, and legal inspection and enforcement officers, the School of Transport at FNU is your pathway to success.

Aisea now looks forward to completing his programme and working for a year before pursuing further studies at the degree and master's level.

Gaurav Pandey's story is one of hope and inspiration. It is a testament to the power of dreams, hard work, and the unwavering support of a community that stretches across continents.


