USER ENGAGEMENT SERVICES

The Fiji National University Library successfully conducted a two-day Information literacy and reference managing tools training on 21-22 May 2025 at Labasa Campus, with sessions held at both the LTD Building and Naduna Campus. A total of 269 students and 10 staff participated, gaining valuable skills in academic research, database searching, and citation management. With strong support from Campus Head Dr. Taraivini, the training covered key areas including navigation of the FNU Library website, use of academic databases, and citation tools such as RefWorks (APA 7th) and EndNote. The program reinforced the library's commitment to research excellence and future outreach across all campuses.





ENDNOTE REFERENCE MANAGEMENT TRAINING FOR CENTRE FOR GRADUATE STUDIES STUDENTS AND ACADEMICS AT LAUTOKA AND NASINU

The Department of Library Services, in collaboration with the Centre for Graduate Studies, held successful EndNote 21 workshops for Post Graduate students and academic staff at Nasinu and Lautoka campuses in June 2025. The sessions focused on enhancing reference management skills and were well attended, offering hands-on training in EndNote's latest features. The workshops received positive feedback and reinforced the library's role in supporting research excellence across campuses.



In the second quarter of 2025, the FNU Library conducted a series of specialized training sessions to support the Centre for Graduate Studies students in developing advanced research skills. Key highlights included a virtual Zoom session on May 13th, 2025 focused on database search strategies, a Hindi-language EndNote and database workshop for PhD students on May 23rd, 2025 and an in-person EndNote training on June 6th at Natabua Campus for Post Graduate Students and research scholars. These sessions provided practical tools to boost research efficiency and foster academic independence.



COMMUNITY OUTREACH AND ENGAGEMENT

On June 9th, 2025, the Library team proudly participated in the celebration of International Archives Day held at the National Archives of Fiji. This year's global theme, "Archives are Accessible – Archives for Everyone," emphasized inclusivity and the vital role archives play in preserving and sharing knowledge with all members of society. The National Archives of Fiji, established in 1954, is the official custodian of government records and historically significant documents. Its collections include administrative records, photographs, maps, and manuscripts from the colonial era. A key highlight is the Deed of Cession (1874). The Archives also offer digital access to selected materials, promoting public accessibility and the preservation of Fiji's documentary heritage. The library's involvement in this event reinforced its ongoing commitment to supporting the preservation, discovery, and accessibility of cultural and historical knowledge across the nation.







LIBRARY EVENTS FOR COMMUNITY ENGAGMENT'S: SUCCESSFUL DONATION DRIVE AND FREE BOOK GIVEAWAY AT TCL AND FSN LIBRARIES




WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY
