## DAY 3 - PROGRAMME

The final day of the conference will feature a series of optional field visits, providing delegates with practical, on-the-ground insights into sustainable agriculture, Landcare approaches, and community-led development in Fiji.

Hosted by the Ministry of Agriculture, Waterways and Sugar Industry, these visits are designed to complement the conference themes by connecting discussions on extension, livelihoods, and socio-ecological systems with real-world application. Delegates will have the opportunity to engage directly with farmers, community groups, and practitioners, and to explore how Landcare principles are being adapted within the Fijian context.

To accommodate varying travel schedules, comfort levels, and learning interests, a range of field visit options with different durations will be offered. These will include a full-day tour, a three-quarter day option, and a shorter half-day visit.

### Field Trip Options

#### 1. Research to Practice: Sigatoka Valley (Full Day)

This full-day visit will travel to the Sigatoka valley and focus on the connection between agricultural research, extension, and on-ground practice. The program will include visits to the Ministry of Agriculture Sigatoka Research Station, the Taiwanese Technical Mission, and a Landcare farming community in Nakavika. Delegates will gain insight into how research, training, and extension are being translated into practical outcomes for farmers, with a focus on productivity, sustainability, and local adaptation.

#### 2. Organic and Diversified Farming Systems: Sabeto Valley (Three-Quarter Day)

This visit will explore organic and diversified farming systems within the Sabeto Valley. Delegates will visit a mix of established and emerging farm enterprises, including the Bulachino site and a recently established farming operation. The visit will highlight approaches to soil health, crop diversification, and market-oriented production, and provide an opportunity to engage directly with farmers on the opportunities and challenges of transitioning to more sustainable systems.
