"Since then FNU/NTPC has been working with some companies around Fiji to start implementing the psychiatric assessment as part of their selection process. The feedback has been very positive – our platform is easy to use even without much guidance its quote easy to navigate and find your way around," Sketcher said.

Director NTPC Dr Isimeli Tagicakiverata said the software would assist local organisations short-listing and selecting the best candidate for the vacant positions.

"NTPC is delighted to be working with Talegent New Zealand. This software would assist employers in selecting the right candidate with the right skills set and attitude. We at NTPC have a duty to ensure that our training courses are practical, relevant and meet the specific industry needs," Dr Tagicakiverata said.

Acting Deputy Director Executive Management for NTPC, Dhiraj Singh said it was important for local organisations to work with the best software to assist with its recruitment processes.

Singh said NTPC was already working with organisations to test run the software.

"Having the right people for each role is critical to the survival of any organisation. This software is about trying to identify the best suitable candidate for the organisation, creation of succession plans etc. We have tested this software with a few local organisations like the Land Transport Authority (LTA) and the response has been good," Mr Singh said.

The launch was conducted during the 4th National Trainers Conference (NTC), at the Pearl South Pacific Resort in Pacific Harbour.
