She said that a passion for learning is to see the intrinsic value of education and that prepares a person for life's challenges and opportunities.

"Education is a theme that will evolve in Fiji over the coming decades. Fiji is already known for the quality of its education. So I encourage you to continue to inspire future generations in Fiji to share your passion for learning, education and life."

FNU Vice Chancellor, Ikbal Jannif said the College of Humanities and Education focused on being innovative and offered programmes that produced graduates with the necessary skills that the industry required.

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Jannif said together with improving the learning and teaching facilities, the College strongly encourages skills development for its staff.
