“I chose to study at the Fiji National University because I have friends who advised me that FNU has better learning facilities when compared to other institutions,” said Chand.

Speaking from his past experience, Chand said few months ago he was undecided on his career path and it was through the advise he received from the FNU Academic office which enabled him to make a career choice.
